The 12 months to September 2015 saw a marginal increase of 1 per cent in total motor vehicle theft in Australia. Despite this, volumes are still down 7 per cent from five years ago. Of the larger jurisdictions, VIC and WA saw rises in both short term and profit-motivated theft. Where profit-motivated theft activity also increased in QLD, NSW maintained its steady decline.

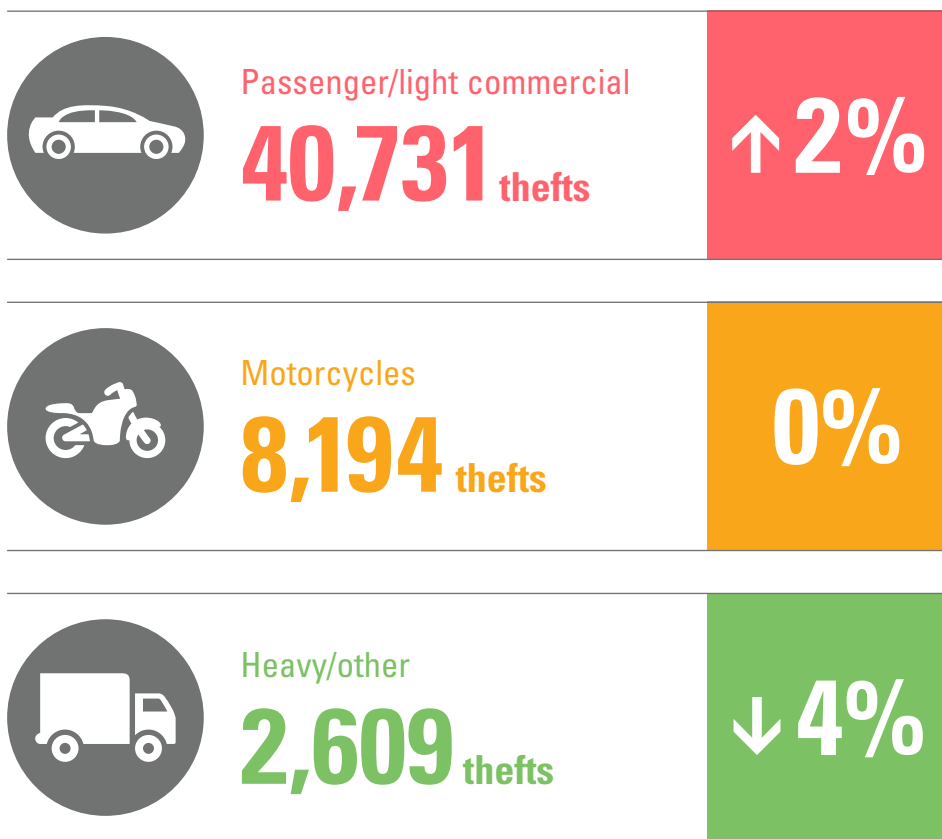

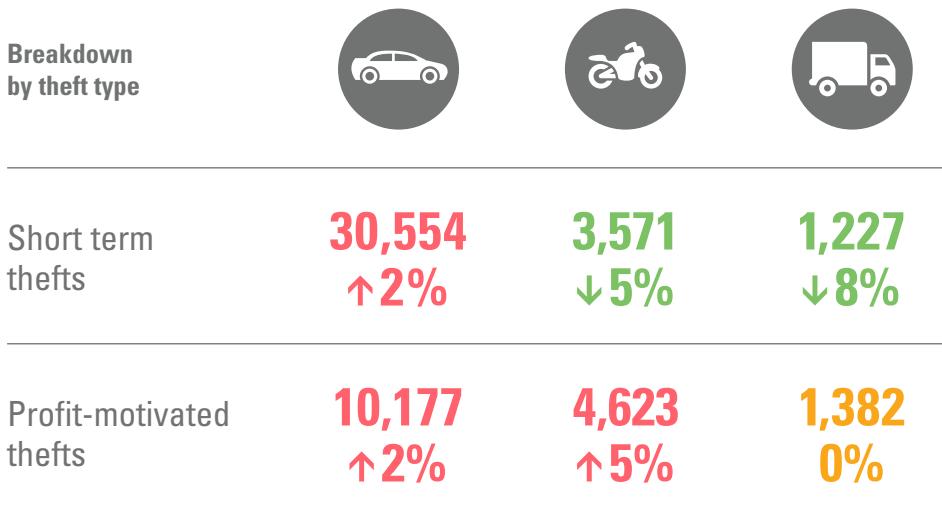

Total vehicle thefts

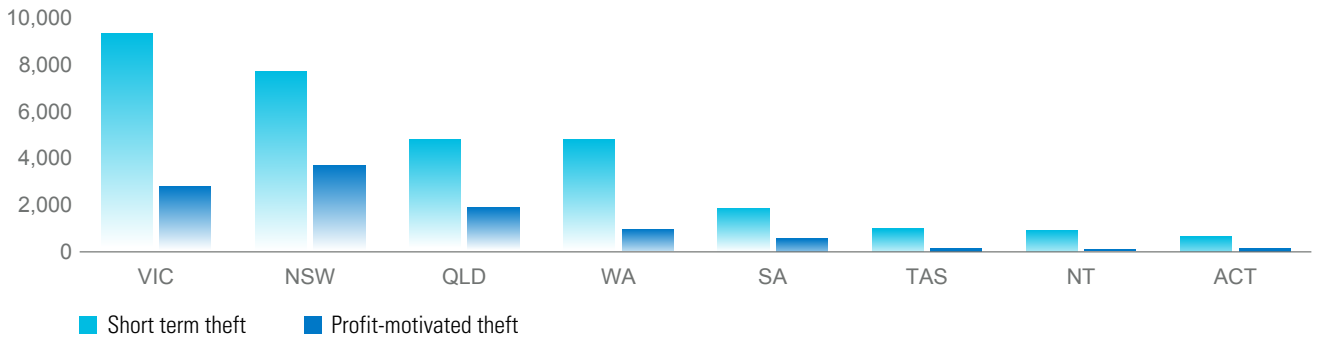


Breakdown by theft type



State and territory breakdown – PLC theft

Number of vehicle thefts 12 months to September 2015



Another increase saw VIC maintain the highest volume of short term PLC thefts. Despite a continuing downward trend NSW still had the largest number of vehicles stolen for profit.

Percentage change from 12 months to September 2014



Of the larger jurisdictions QLD had the greatest percentage reduction in short term PLC theft (9%), and the largest percentage increase in profit-motivated theft (8%).*

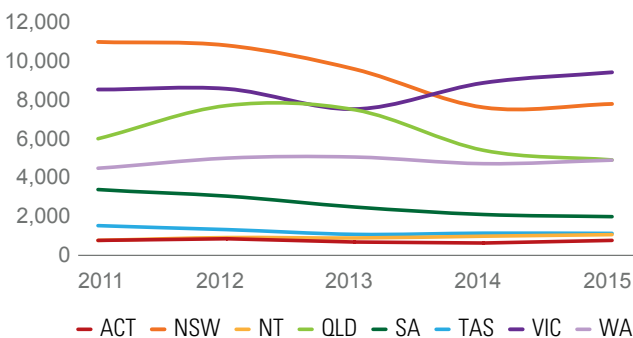

Theft rate per 1,000 registrations



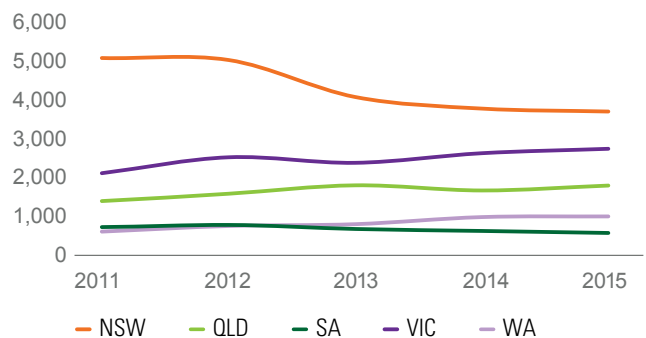
When expressed as a rate per 1,000 registrations, WA has the highest short term theft rate of 2.38 and NSW the highest profit-motivated theft rate of 0.77.*

Short term theft (five year trend to September)



Short term PLC theft has increased 11 per cent in both VIC and WA when compared to five years ago. Proportionally, thefts have also increased significantly in the NT over the same period.

Profit-motivated theft (five year trend to September)



Profit-motivated theft in NSW has fallen 27 per cent over the five year period, with over two-thirds of the reduction being vehicles aged 16 years and over. Profit-motivated theft in the ACT, NT and TAS has remained relatively stable.*
